Strategic expansion, outlook favourable

Summary

- Standalone revenue grew 24.1% y-o-y, on 14.8% volume growth to 2.84 mt and an 8.1% rise in realisations to Rs. 5,388/tonne, leading to a sharp 103.8% y-o-y rise in EBITDA/tonne to Rs. 732.
- Additional 1.35 mtpa grinding unit commissioned at Surat and completed de-bottlenecking at Jaykaypuram and Sirohi, expanding total capacity from 16.5 mtpa to 18 mtpa.
- Phased expansion plan continues through FY28, including brownfield clinker and grinding additions and greenfield plants, with company eyeing a 30 mtpa capacity by FY30.
- We retain our Buy rating and lower our target price to Rs. 992.

Standalone revenue rose 24.1% y-o-y to Rs. 1,531.8 crore in Q2FY26 (9% above estimates), driven by an 8.1% rise in blended realisations to Rs. 5,387/tonne led by a higher sales mix in North and Gujarat markets and greater share of premium products, along with 14.8% growth in volumes to 2.84 million tonnes. Total cost per tonne remained flat y-o-y at Rs. 4,656, enabling a sharp 103.8% y-o-y rise in EBITDA/tonne to Rs. 732. Company commissioned its 1.35 mtpa Surat grinding unit, expanding total capacity from 16.5 mtpa to 18 mtpa. It is executing a phased expansion plan that includes increasing clinker capacity by 2.3 mtpa and adding four cement grinding units (totaling 4.6 mtpa) at Durg, Chhattisgarh, which will take cement capacity to 22.6 mtpa by FY28. In addition, three split-location grinding units (total 3.4 mtpa) are being set up at Prayagraj, Madhubani and Patratu. Total capex of Rs. 3,000 crore (Rs. 50 crore spent till date) will be funded through Rs. 2,100 crore of debt and the rest via internal accruals. Beyond FY28, the company plans greenfield projects at Nagaur (3 mtpa), Kutch (3 mtpa) and Assam (2-2.5 mtpa), in line with its long-term goal of a 30 mtpa capacity by FY30. The management reaffirmed its cost-reduction target of Rs. 100-120/tonne over the next 18-24 months, supported by higher renewable energy usage and operational efficiency initiatives.

Key positives

• EBITDA/tonne rose by 103.8% y-o-y to Rs 732.

Key negatives

Power & fuel cost increased q-o-q impacted by temporary WHR shutdowns for maintenance, lower solar generation during monsoon months, and higher imported petcoke prices (at \$116–120/tonne).

Management Commentary

- Capex guidance maintained at Rs. 1,000-1,200 crore for FY26, with a total capex plan of Rs. 2,500-3,000 crore over the next two years.
- Industry volumes grew 6-7% y-o-y in Q2FY26, while J.K. Lakshmi's growth outperformed the industry average.
- Trade mix stable at 53%, premium mix improved to 26% (from 23%), blended cement share at 92%, lead
 distance reduced to 395 km (from 399 km), green power share at 46%, and specific heat consumption
 steady at 1.61 Kcal/kg.
- Management continues to target EBITDA/tonne of Rs. 1,000 in the medium term, supported by cost
 optimisation, premiumisation, and efficiency improvement initiatives.

Revision in earnings estimates – We have lowered our EBITDA margin estimates for FY26 and FY27E and have introduced estimates for FY28 in our analysis.

Valuation – Retain Buy with revised PT of Rs. 992: JKL has been focusing on achieving healthy volume growth and significant improvements in operational profitability. Ongoing capacity expansion plans are expected to drive its next phase of growth. Furthermore, the consolidation of key subsidiaries, particularly UCWL, is likely to streamline operations and management while generating synergistic benefits. JKL is currently trading at an EV/EBITDA multiple of approximately 8.5x/7.8x/7.2x for FY2026E/FY2027E/FY2028E earnings. We retain our Buy rating with a revised price target of Rs. 992.

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Outlook and Valuation

■ Sector Outlook - Improving demand brightens outlook

The Indian cement has witnessed a lot of consolidation in the last few years with a slew of inorganic acquisitions happening. The consolidation and the weak demand have put a pressure on the pricing environment. However, with the return of government capex, the demand and pricing are expected to improve. The sector's margins are expected to improve from here-on and drive up profitability.

■ Company Outlook – Capacity expansion to power next leg of growth

JKL is expected to benefit from sustained rural sector demand and infrastructure demand improvement. Pricing in key regions remains healthy. However, the company is facing constraints with clinker capacity utilisation at a peak level over the trailing peak quarters. The company is doubled its Surat grinding units to 2.7 million tonnes and undertaking 2.3 mtpa clinker capacity and 4.6 mtpa cement grinding capacity at Durg and three split cement grinding units aggregating 3.4 mtpa in UP, Bihar, and Jharkhand, which would provide the next leg of growth.

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About company

JKL was set up in 1982 in Sirohi, Rajasthan. The company is part of JK Group, which operates in India and abroad and is present in the tyre, cement, paper, power transmission and sealing solutions, dairy products, and textile industries. The company has a wide network of over 7,000 dealers across Rajasthan, Gujarat, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Jammu and Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, South Bengal, Vidharbha, Mumbai, and Pune.

Investment theme

JKL is expected to benefit from sustained demand in the rural sector, along with improvements in infrastructure demand. The pricing environment in key regions remains healthy. The company added a 1.3 million tonne grinding unit capacity in Surat. Additionally, a 2.3 million tonne clinker unit and a 4.6 million tonne grinding unit capacity in Durg are expected to be commissioned in phases between FY27 and FY28. JKL is also implementing various measures to reduce costs and improve operational efficiency. The company's goal to reach a total capacity of 30 million tonnes by 2030 remains on track.

Key Risks

- Pressure on cement demand and cement prices in the Northwest and Eastern regions of India can affect financial performance.
- Macroeconomic challenges leading to lower government spending on infrastructure and housing sectors can negatively affect the company's performance.
